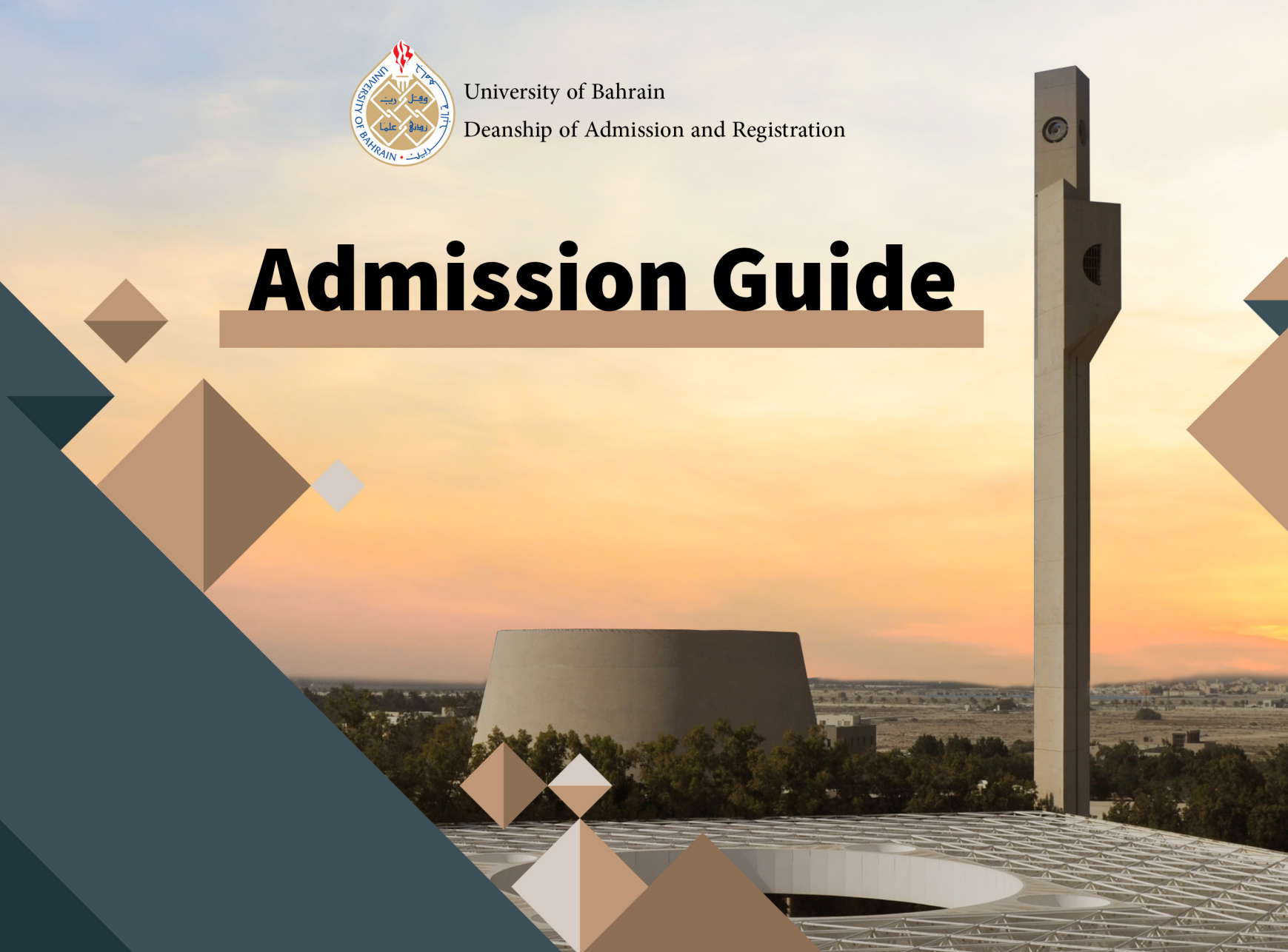

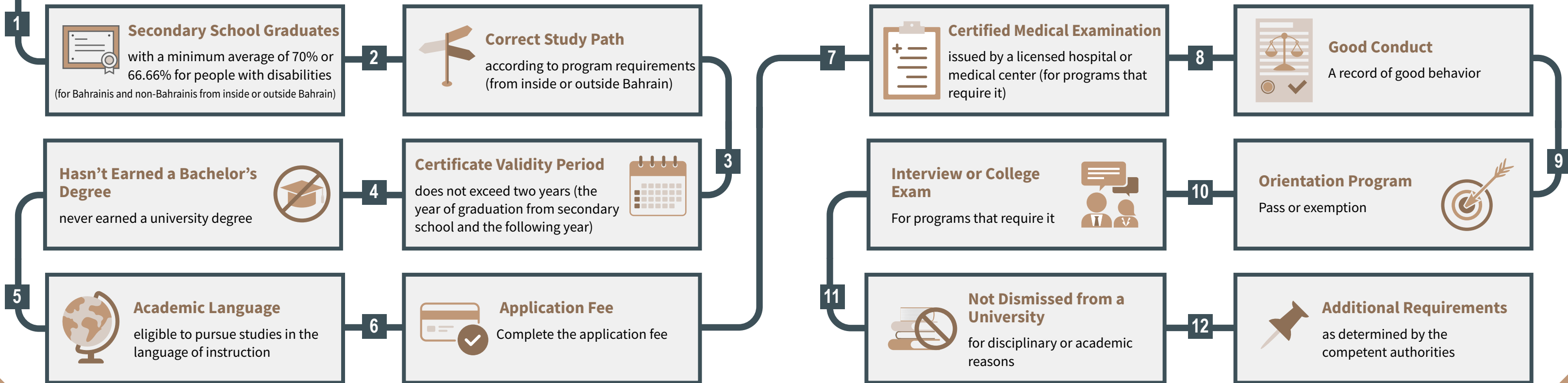

Admission Requirements



Secondary School Certificates

Academic Disciplines of which Student are Eligible for Admission to the University of Bahrain:

1. Secondary School Certificate in the following tracks (provided that the GPA should not be less than 70%):

Scientific track, Literary track, commercial track, religious track, industrial developed track, commercial developed track, unified track, Administrative and Technological, commercial or industrial apprenticeship (advanced), Graduates of Nasser Centre for Science and Technology.

The University accredits certificates granted by private schools in the Kingdom of Bahrain, which are recognized by the Ministry of Education, provided that these certificates are based on twelve academic years starting from the first year of primary school.

2. Arab Secondary School Certificate granted by the Ministries of Education in Arab countries:

This certificate shall be treated the same as the Bahraini general secondary school certificate after being approved by the competent authorities in the Ministry of Education, provided that these certificates should be based on twelve academic years starting from the first year of primary school.

3. Pakistan Higher Secondary School Certificate: The University accredits the second section of this certificate only.

4. India Higher Secondary School Certificate: The University accredits the Senior level of these certificates only.

5. Accepted International Certificates: IGCSE/GCSE and IB

Graduates of Private Schools within the Kingdom of Bahrain

Applications are submitted through the Student Information System (SIS) and reviewed as follows:

- Attestation of the qualification by the Private Education Directorate at the Ministry of Education.
- **Determination of the high school GPA:** The GPA listed in the official letter issued by the Private Education Directorate at the Ministry of Education is adopted.
- **Classification of the high school track:** The student's track is determined based on the majority of completed subjects, as follows:
 - **Scientific Track:** if science subjects are the majority in the transcript.
 - **Commercial Track:** if commercial subjects are the majority in the transcript.
 - **Literary Track:** if literary subjects are the majority in the transcript.

Note: If the number of subjects is equal between two tracks, the track chosen by the student will be maintained. (For example: if the student has completed 3 science courses and 3 commercial courses, and selected the scientific track during the application process, it will be kept as is).

Graduates of Schools Outside the Kingdom of Bahrain

Applications are submitted through the Student Information System (SIS) and reviewed and processed as follows:

- **First: Bahraini students:** must submit an equivalency certificate or have their qualification attested by the Ministry of Education.
- **Second: Non-Bahraini students:** must submit a certificate attested by the relevant authorities in the country issuing the qualification, along with all necessary attestations required by the Kingdom of Bahrain.
- **Third: Determination of the high school GPA:** The certificate is evaluated according to the following:
 - If the student graduated from a country that follows the same educational system as Bahrain, the GPA stated on the certificate will be adopted.
 - If the student graduated from a country that does not follow the same educational system as Bahrain, the qualification will be assessed by the Deanship of Admissions and Registration, which will submit its recommendation to the University Council for approval.
- **Fourth: Classification of the high school track:** The high school track is determined in the same manner as for graduates of private schools within the Kingdom of Bahrain.

Admission Policy:

1. A competitive admission rate is applied, based primarily on the secondary school certificate, which serves as the general criterion for accepting students into the university.
2. Placement into bachelor's degree programs is determined competitively based on the student's secondary school average, the availability of seats, the order of the student's stated preferences, and the fulfillment of the program's specific admission requirements.
In the event that all available seats in a program are filled, the remaining applicants may be placed in programs within the College of Applied Studies, provided the student has expressed interest in joining this college. A student will only be admitted to the College of Applied Studies if they have willingly chosen it—whether during the initial application period or later, during the post-admission confirmation phase (“waiting list”).
3. Applicants who are not initially admitted to the University will be placed on waiting lists. These students will be offered admission if seats become available following the announcement of admission results and during the admission confirmation period.

4. A student who, during the admission confirmation period, expresses a desire to change their assigned program will be considered for placement into other available programs after the confirmation period ends and after excluding applicants who have decided not to enroll at the University.
5. Non-Bahraini students are treated the same as Bahraini students with regard to tuition fees if the student is either the child of a Bahraini mother or a foreign mother with a Bahraini husband.
6. A scholarship student is admitted directly into the academic program specified in their scholarship letter, whether issued from within the Kingdom of Bahrain or abroad. Such students are exempt from the automated placement process and from competing with other applicants, provided they meet the admission requirements of the specified academic program.
7. Students may apply for course equivalency in accordance with the provisions of Clause (III), Article (10) of the University of Bahrain's Study and Examination Regulations.

- Most courses consist of 3 credit hours, at a rate of BD 8 BHD per hour for Bahraini students. The fee for a single course is BD 24. When registering for 5 courses, the fee is BD 120 for the semester.
- Adherence to the approved semester count for graduation is mandatory.
- Summer semesters and the orientation program are not counted toward the maximum limit.
- Support includes: Children of Bahraini father or mother and Bahraini wife.
- Tuition fees for non-Bahraini students remain fixed throughout their study period.

Important Note:
Admission test and personal interview

College admission requirements are determined by the type of general secondary school certificate, such as Literary, Science, Commercial, Industrial, Unified Tracks, or the Nasser Centre for Science and Technology, and must align with the designated programs of each college. In some cases, interviews or admission tests may also be required.

The student will be contacted by the concerned department in the college to schedule the admission test and personal interview for programs that require them. In the event the candidate does not pass the admission tests, they will be admitted to other academic programs based on available vacancies.

- Secondary school certificate.
- A copy of a valid passport or proof of renewal in case of expiry.
- A valid ID card or proof of renewal in case of expiry (non- Bahraini).
- A colored photograph.
- Secondary School Transcript (6 semesters).
- A statement of good conduct issued by the school.
- Private school students: A statement, graduation certificate, and transcript issued by the Ministry of Education must be attached when submitting the application, along with a statement and graduation certificate and transcript of grades from the school
- Foreign applicants residing in Bahrain, provide a copy of a valid residence permit or proof of its renewal.
- Secondary school graduates from outside the Kingdom of Bahrain for Bahrainis and Gulf nationals: please obtain the graduation certificate accreditation from the Ministry of Education.

12 Pay Application Fees BD 10 (non-refundable).

13 You will receive your university ID number and the receipt of the application fees via email. Please keep this information.

14 Applicants may upload documents or update information after completing the application process during the application period.

Admission results will be announced through the Student Information System (SIS) website and the Information and e-Government Authority (IGA) website. Confirmation of admission will be through the Student Information System (SIS) website only.

To view the admission result and confirmation of admission to the University of Bahrain, please follow the steps below:

- 1 Log into sis.uob.edu.bh
- 2 Search “UOB Admission Requests”
- 3 Select “Undergraduate Applications”
- 4 Enter the University ID in the Username field and the password in the Password field.



Important Note: Applicants who submitted their applications through the Information & eGovernment Authority website can view their admission results by following the steps below:

- Visit the Student Information System (SIS) at sis.uob.edu.bh
- Click on the “Forgot Password?” link and follow the instructions to reset your password
- Log in to the system using your University ID as the username and the new password you created

a. Accepted Students: Steps to Confirm Admission

- 1 View the student's pledge:** verify the student's personal ID number, name, and nationality, then enter the University's Study rules and regulations link, and specify disability type (if any).
- 2 Review the Instructions:** view the Orientation Program regulations, the instructions for changing Preferences, and instructions for canceling admission.
- 3 Parents Information:** Indicate the educational qualification of one or both parents, and specify the highest academic degree obtained.
- 4 View the acceptance letter:** the program you have been admitted to, the study duration of the Orientation program, and general instructions.
- 5 View the tuition fee payment instructions.**
- 6 Pay the tuition fees:** BD 128 for Bahrainis, and BD 640 for non-Bahrainis (includes Admission Confirmation Fees and first semester Study Fees).



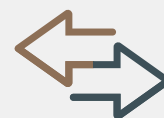
Very Important Notes:

- The University confirms that the application for admission shall be considered canceled if the student does not confirm their acceptance on the specified date.
- Students are admitted only once, during the first semester of each academic year.
- Admission is valid only for the semester in which the applicant is accepted. Postponing admission or failing to enroll is not permitted.



Scholarship Students:

- You can print the acceptance letter through the website and deliver it to the entity providing the scholarship.



Changing Preferences:

- You may submit a request to change your preferences based on available vacancies after confirming your admission and paying the tuition fees, through (sis.uob.edu.bh) by selecting the "Post Admission Service" option and specifying three preferences during the confirmation period. Requests will be reviewed after the confirmation period ends, depending on the availability of seats in the academic programs.

b. Students on Waiting List

(Accepted) Application, the message that appears:

The university apologizes for not accepting your application at present. If you still wish to be considered for any vacancies that may become available after the admission confirmation period, please click the (YES) button during the admission period. If you no longer wish to pursue admission, please click (NO). Requests will be considered based on available vacancies, and you may be allowed to select your preferences at a later stage.

(Not Final) Application, the message that appears:

The university, while appreciating your valued trust, regrets to inform you that your admission application could not be accepted due to the incomplete submission of the required documents to finalize the admission process. This decision is based on previous communications from the Department of Admission and Alumni Affairs via phone calls, email, or SMS. If you still wish to join the university, you may log in to the Student Information System and update your information through the available options.

c. Rejected Students

(Rejected) students, the message that appears:

You will see a message stating that according to the university's rules and regulations, you are not allowed to enroll in the University of Bahrain.

Important Notes on Admission:

English language placement test for students admitted to the Orientation Program

The timing for the English language placement test for students admitted to the orientation program is communicated through the Student Information System (SIS). Students must access the site during the period announced by the university via its website, social media, and social networking platforms. The student may log in using:

Username: University ID number
Password: your password

Once logged in, the scheduled test dates will appear. If the student does not show up for the test during the scheduled time, they will be automatically enrolled in the Pre-Intermediate level.



Note: Students can create or change their password through the link ‘Forgot your password?’ and follow the usual steps to reset the password.

For non-Bahraini students (have Bahraini nationality but are not updated in the system or treated as Bahrainis):

1. If there is a difference in the nationality mentioned on the confirmation screen, or if one of the parents is Bahraini or the spouse is Bahraini, please follow the steps below:
2. Enter the link (UOB Admission Requests).
3. Enter the link option (Request to Update Nationality).
4. Enter (username = university number) and (PIN = personal number or ID number).
5. Enter the correct information and upload the required documents.
6. Review and confirm that the correct nationality appears on the pledge page, and upon modification you can finalize the confirmation of admission and payment of tuition fees.

Students admitted to the College of Applied Studies

Students admitted to the College of Applied Studies may request a transfer to other programs if they meet the following required conditions:

- Successfully completed the first semester of the Associate Degree Program with a cumulative GPA no less than 3.5 out of 4.00, with a minimum of 12 credits.
- Successfully completed the second semester of the Associate Degree Program with a cumulative GPA no less than 3.00 out of 4.00, with a minimum of 30 credits.
- Successfully completed the Associate Degree Program with a cumulative GPA no less than 3.00 out of 4.00



Admission of Students with Disabilities

The University of Bahrain is committed to supporting students with disabilities and special needs, beginning with the admission process. It ensures equal opportunities for enrollment in academic programs and offers a wide range of facilities and services tailored to their needs. This support is in line with both local and international laws that protect their rights and promote their academic and personal development.

Students with disabilities may be admitted to their chosen program during the university's admission period, provided they pass the program's admission test, if required.

During the admission confirmation process, please indicate the type of disability and attach the necessary official documentation to facilitate all admission and registration procedures.

Orientation Program

A unified program for all new undergraduate students, to equip them with essential skills in English, academic subjects, and personal development, ensuring a successful transition into university-level studies. Completion of the Orientation Program is a prerequisite for admission to academic programs.

Conditions of Exemption from the Orientation Program and the English language placement test:

- ✓ Students with a secondary school average of at least 90%.
- ✓ Students with an average score of not less than 90% in all English language courses at the secondary level.
- ✓ Students with a valid IELTS certificate with a minimum score of 5.5, or an equivalent score in TOEFL.
- ✓ Students holding internationally recognized general secondary education certificates such as A-Level, IB, or their equivalents.



Note: Students with an average between 70% and 89.99% in secondary school are allowed to take exemption test from the Orientation Program Exemption and English Placement Test administered by the English Language Center at the university.

Levels and classification of the program according to the result of the English placement test:

Exam result	level	Duration
Below average	Pre-intermediate	2 semesters
average	Intermediate	1 semester

Study Program Plan and Evaluation System

The Orientation Program consists of 16 credit hours: 12 credit hours for English language courses and 4 credit hours for a personal skills course. Students are assessed according to the university's grading system; however, these grades are not included in the GPA calculation.

Conditions for Continuation:

- Students may only enroll in the academic major after successfully passing the program.
- The final exam may be repeated only once.
- Withdrawal or postponement during the program is prohibited. Students who fail or are absent will be dismissed from the program.
- For WE/WA cases, the course may be repeated only once.

Students scoring 90% or above in the Pre-Intermediate level qualify for the Intermediate Level Exemption Examination. Successful students may advance directly to their formally admitted academic program.

General Guidelines

Dear Student, when submitting your application to the University of Bahrain, please keep the following in mind:

- University life is primarily a stage of self-reliance.
- You are responsible for communicating with all relevant entities, such as Admissions and Registration, Student Affairs, academic departments, colleges, and support services.
- Stay informed by following the University's official communication channels on Instagram, X, the official website, your university email, and your SIS student account. Always rely on official sources for information.
- Don't hesitate to ask for help if you face any difficulties at the university.
- Make sure you leave the university with two key accomplishments:
 - Academic success (your university degree)
 - Personal growth through participation in student activities.



Academic Guidelines

New applicants are encouraged to read the following information carefully to ensure they meet all requirements and fully understand the procedures:

- 1 Familiarize yourself with the admission criteria, required documents, and the types of secondary school certificates accepted by the university and its colleges, as well as the application process.



- 2 Submit your application for university admission through the Information and eGovernment Authority website (Bahrain.bh) if you are: a Bahraini or non-Bahraini graduate of a public school in the Kingdom of Bahrain (current or previous academic year).



- 3 Submit your application through the Student Information System (SIS) website (sis.uob.edu.bh) for the following categories: Bahraini and non-Bahraini graduates of private schools in the Kingdom of Bahrain (current or previous academic year), Bahraini and non-Bahraini graduates from schools outside Bahrain, and Graduates of the Nasser Centre for Science and Technology.



- 4 Review the study plan and course details for your intended program on the university's official website or by consulting an academic advisor.



- 5 Familiarize yourself with and adhere to the university's rules and regulations.



- 6 Regularly check the academic calendar.
