INTRODUCTION

The University of Bahrain (UOB) is committed to transparency and accountability in delivering high-quality education. Student feedback is crucial in the continuous improvement processes, ensuring excellence in teaching, learning, and the overall student experience.

In 2023, the UOB implemented Explorance Blue, an advanced surveys management system that seamlessly integrate with the university's Learning Management System (LMS), Blackboard. The Explorance Blue Platform has transformed the evaluation processes by supporting diverse course formats, including theoretical, industrial training, thesis, practical, and senior project courses. The platform also introduced multi-level reporting capabilities, enabling detailed analysis at the faculty, department, and university levels. This enhancement strengthened the feedback loop, fostering a culture of continuous improvement and data-driven decision-making.

Building on this foundation, UOB further refined the Student Course Evaluation Survey in the academic year 2024-2025 to comprehensively assess both course content and faculty performance. This refinement ensures a holistic evaluation of the teaching and learning experience, aligning with the university's commitment to academic excellence.

During the evaluation process, students provide feedback on various aspects of their courses. The results are systematically compiled into section-specific reports, which are then aggregated into faculty reports. This approach allows for a detailed analysis of the relationship between course evaluations and faculty performance. To ensure confidentiality, student identities remain anonymous throughout the process. Faculty members have access to their individual evaluation results, while department heads, college quality assurance directors, and deans can review evaluations for faculty within their respective departments.

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The course evaluation survey measures student satisfaction across the following key areas:















1. OVERALL RESPONSE RATE
