

Major Requirements Courses Descriptions

Course Code: NUR115 Course Title: Introduction to Nursing

Comprehend an overview of the history of nursing, its nature, and roles at the national and international level with emphasis on the basic concepts of ethical and legal aspects of the Nursing profession. Utilize the nursing process as a framework to provide safe and competent nursing care.

Course Code: NUR126 Course Title: Health Education and Promotion

Discover the theoretical foundations of health promotion and wellness across life span. Comprehend the concepts of health education, teaching methods and skills in primary health care. Apply the concepts disease prevention and management to enhance the health of individuals, families, and society. Explore the health promotion services available in the Kingdom of Bahrain and apply various health promotion models to promote, maintain, and restore health.

Course Code: NUR125 Course Title: Fundamentals of Nursing I

Acquire knowledge and competencies required to provide basic nursing care for simulated clients using the nursing process approach in the skill lab. Apply the principles of asepsis, body mechanics, vital signs, and fluid regulation. Provide basic nursing care to meet simulated client's needs concerning hygiene and grooming, nutrition, elimination, and sleep.

Course Code: NUR210 Course Title: Health Assessment

Develop theoretical knowledge, skills, and attitude to conduct health assessment of an adult client. Practice the skills of history taking, and different methods of physical examination. Apply critical thinking and effective communication skills while conducting a comprehensive health assessment to evaluate the health status of an adult client.

Course Code: NUR215 Course Title: Fundamentals of Nursing II

Explore theoretical knowledge for the fundamentals of nursing practice. Utilize nursing process as framework in medication administration, providing perioperative nursing care, and supporting the client/family through the loss and grieving process following the Bahrain code of ethics.

Course Code: NUR216 Course Title: Fundamentals of Nursing II-Clinical

Integrate the basic nursing skills in the real clinical situation with emphasis on assessment and meeting client's needs using the nursing process approach. Administer medication and provide perioperative nursing care.

Course Code: NUR225 Course Title: Adult Health Nursing I

Explore the common medical /surgical problems of adult clients. Analyze the incidence, pre-disposing factors, etiology, pathophysiology, and diagnostic studies of various disease conditions concerning gastrointestinal, metabolic/endocrine, urinary, immunological, and musculoskeletal systems. Utilize the nursing process as a framework to formulate nursing diagnosis and nursing interventions directed towards promoting, maintaining, and restoring health of adults and their families.

Course Code: NUR226 Course Title: Adult Health Nursing I - Clinical

Demonstrate nursing competencies in managing an adult client with various health problems concerning gastrointestinal, metabolic/endocrine, urinary, reproductive, immunological, and musculoskeletal systems in a variety of health care settings. Utilize critical thinking, clinical reasoning, clinical judgment, and effective communication skills using the code of professional conduct to provide comprehensive nursing care to an adult client.

Course Code: NUR315 Course Title: Adult Health Nursing II

Develop the knowledge in providing evidence-based nursing care to meet the needs of adult clients with common medical and surgical health problems. Analyze the incidence, pre-disposing factors, etiology, pathophysiology, and diagnostic studies of various disease conditions concerning respiratory, cardiovascular, neurology, and hematology, integumentary, and sensorineural systems. Utilize the nursing process as a framework to formulate nursing diagnosis and nursing interventions directed towards promoting, maintaining, and restoring the health of adults and their families.

Course Code: NUR316 Course Title: Adult Health Nursing II-Clinical

Apply nursing competencies in managing an adult client with various health problems concerning respiratory, cardiovascular, neurology, and hematology, reproductive, integumentary, and sensorineural systems in a variety of health care settings. Incorporate critical thinking, clinical reasoning, clinical judgment, and effective communication skills using code of professional conduct to provide comprehensive nursing care to an adult client.

Course Code: NUR312 Course Title: Nursing Research and Evidence Based Practice

Comprehend the research process related to professional nursing practice. Explore both quantitative and qualitative methodologies with a focus on how to conduct research related to the area of practice. Apply the ethical considerations and philosophical underpinnings of research. Integrate the basic research skill in literature review, research methodologies, data collection and analysis methods.

Course Code: NUR 313 Course Title: Mental Health Nursing

Explore the basic concepts, principles, and theories related to various mental health disorders. Provide comprehensive nursing care for clients with mental health disorders. Develop positive attitude toward the prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of mental illness.

Course Code: NUR 314 Course Title: Mental Health Nursing-Clinical

Utilize the clinical experience to explore and gain insight into mental health problems. Apply the essential knowledge, skills, and attitudes to provide comprehensive nursing care in the prevention, treatment, and rehabilitation of clients with mental health problems using nursing process as a framework.

Course Code: NUR220 Course Title: Gerontological Nursing

Scrutinize the basic concepts of gerontological nursing and its social implications. Develop awareness about the clients in older adulthood stages of the human life cycle. Explore the older adult's needs and problems facing the current generation of older adults and minimizing dependency.

Course Code: NUR320 Course Title: Obstetrics and Gynecological Nursing

Develop knowledge and competencies on the concepts and principles of obstetrics and gynecological nursing, which comprise of antenatal, intra-natal, postnatal care and family planning including assessment and immediate care of the normal newborn. Identify the high-risk pregnancy, and gynecological conditions of women in different stages of their lives. Utilize the nursing process approach as a framework to meet the reproductive health care needs of women

Course Code: NUR321 Course Title: Obstetric and Gynecological Nursing -Clinical

Apply the maternal nursing competencies in the provision of care for women during perinatal period. Implement the clinical skills in different areas of pregnancy, labor, puerperium, and gynecological problems.

Course Code: NUR322 Course Title: Pediatric Nursing

Explore the common pediatric medical/surgical problems in Bahrain. Apply the principles of growth and development and identify the deviations from normal in common childhood illnesses. Provide comprehensive nursing care to children from conception to adolescence in medical/surgical and critical care settings. Utilize the nursing process and family-centered care approach as a framework to promote, maintain, and restore the health of pediatric clients and their families.

Course Code: NUR323 Course Title: Pediatric Nursing -Clinical

Develop skills necessary for providing nursing care of healthy as well as ill children from conception through adolescence. Perform a health assessment and design a holistic nursing care plan to meet the physical and psychological needs of children. Incorporate the nursing process and family-centered care approach in providing nursing care.

Course Code: NUR430 Course Title: Health policy and Nursing leadership

Comprehend the concepts, principles and theories of nursing management and leadership. Implement strategic management interventions at diverse healthcare facilities. Apply contemporary managerial and leadership skills in various health care settings.

Course Code: NUR413 Course Title: Health and professional Issues

Explore Examine legal, professional, and ethical issues and their impact on nursing profession. Apply the ethical theories, concepts, principles in the contemporary nursing practice's ethical issues. Engage in a thoughtful discussion and debate ethical dilemmas related to professional nursing practice.

Course Code: NUR 416 Course Title: Community Health Nursing

Explore a broad perspective of community health nursing (CHN) and health care delivery system, health promotion and disease prevention. Apply the basic concepts of epidemiology, biostatistics, and communicable diseases prevention. Identify the family and community's health needs and problems and their management.

Course Code: NUR 417 Course Title: Community Health Nursing – clinical

Conduct community and family assessment to identify healthcare needs. Provide comprehensive nursing care to clients and their families. Implement strategies of health promotion, and disease prevention in diverse community settings. Utilize critical thinking and a problem-solving approach utilizing the nursing process approach.

Course Code: NUR418 Course Title: Essentials of Critical Care Nursing

Scrutinize the various acute and critical health problems affecting adults' patients with cardiovascular, pulmonary, nervous, digestive, and endocrine systems. Acquire advanced health assessment skills to effectively provide comprehensive nursing care for critically ill patients.

Course Code: NUR419 Course Title: Essentials of Critical Care Nursing-Clinical

Provide comprehensive nursing care for adult patients with cardiovascular, pulmonary, nervous, digestive, and endocrine health problems in acute care settings. Incorporate critical thinking, problem-solving, discission making, and effective communication skills using a code of ethics.

Course Code: NUR421 Course Title: Integrated Nursing Practicum I

Integrate the cumulative knowledge, skills, and attitude in the provision of comprehensive nursing care under the mentorship of a registered nurse. Demonstrate safe nursing care following the Professional Code of Conduct and leadership skills

Course Code: NUR422 Course Title: Integrated Nursing Practicum II

Consolidate the theoretical knowledge and clinical competencies acquired from different nursing fields throughout the program. Provide competent, holistic, and evidence-based nursing care at any clinical area under supervision. Apply critical thinking and clinical decision-making skills at various clinical settings.

Major Support Courses Descriptions

Course Code: SBS117 Course Title: Introduction to Sociology

Acquire the basic sociological concepts that are useful in understanding the features of the larger society. Discover the influence of the societal circumstances on people's life.

Course Code: SBS125 Course Title: Introduction to Psychology

Explore approaches and concepts in contemporary psychology. Adopt the basic psychological principles to meet the clients' psychological needs.

Course Code: SBS315 Course Title: Developmental Psychology

Explore various developmental theories such as psychosocial, cognitive, and moral. Examine the factors influencing the humans' development at different stages of life.

Course Code: LFS233 Course Title: Clinical Nutrition

You will be introduced to the impact of nutrition on health. You will learn to use nutritional tools to evaluate the adequacy of a diet based on individual needs. General concepts of diet modification in various diseases and special conditions are discussed to help you to select /suggest suitable foods for patients with special needs.

Course Code: CGS125 Course Title: Biochemistry

Apply the principles of biochemistry and their relevance to the clinical field. Acquire the knowledge of the major metabolic pathways and their clinical significance and explore the role of these pathways and their contribution in maintaining homeostasis.

Course Code: PHA320 Course Title: Pharmacology for Nurses

This course will introduce you to the pharmacology of various drug classes acting on different body systems. You will also explore various aspects of drugs, how to effectively apply them and educate patients on their use for maximum safety and efficacy.

Major Elective Courses Descriptions

Course Code: NUR324 Course Title: Transcultural Nursing

Explore specific transcultural nursing concepts, principles and strategies to help the students in making nursing clinical decisions. Assess cultural care differences and similarities among cultures to provide culturally congruent and competent nursing care. Utilize transcultural nursing theory to discover and guide nursing care practices.

Course Code: NUR325 Course Title: Counselling

Employ the basic concepts of counselling and self-awareness required for interacting with individuals. Implement therapeutic communication techniques, self-awareness, counselling, and its process in clients' interview. Explore therapeutic relationship and ethical issues in nursing practice. Acquire knowledge and counselling skills in managing the clients in various situations.

Course Code: NUR329 Course Title: Technology in Nursing

Develop knowledge required for using information technology and health care data management systems in nursing education, practice, and research. Utilize information technology in nursing care, decision-making, quality improvement initiatives, and client education. Apply the professional, legal, and ethical challenges surrounding the use of informatics in nursing practice.

Course Code: NUR330 Course Title: Complementary and Alternative Therapies

Explores alternative remedies as complementary to the existing western medical treatments. Figure out the description, therapeutic action, and cultural origin of different types of complementary and alternative therapies.

University Requirements Courses Descriptions

Course Code: ARAB 110 Course Title: Arabic Language Skills

This course focuses on basic Arabic skills including form, function, and meaning. It also helps the student to appreciate and understand structures and approach them from a critical point of view, through various genres in literature.

Course Code: HIST 122 Course Title: Modern History of Bahrain and Citizenship

Spatial identity of Bahrain: Brief history of Bahrain until the 18th century; the historical roots of the formation of the national identity of Bahrain since the 18th century; the modern state and evolution of constitutional life in Bahrain; the Arabic and Islamic dimensions of the identity of Bahrain; the core values of Bahrain's society and citizenship rights (legal, political, civil and economic); duties; responsibilities and community participation; economic change and development in Bahrain's Gulf, Arab and international relations.

Course Code: HRLC 107 Course Title: Human Rights Principles

This course deals with the principles of human rights in terms of the definition of human rights, scope, sources with a focus on the International Bill of Human Rights; The Charter of the United Nations; Universal Declaration of Human Rights; The International Covenant on Economics, Social and Culture rights; Convention against Torture and other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment; Mechanics and the Constitutional Protection of Rights and Public Freedoms in Kingdom of Bahrain.

Course Code: ISLM 101 Course Title: Islamic Culture

An introduction to the general outline and principles of Islamic culture, its general characteristics, its relationships with other cultures, general principles of Islam in beliefs, worship, legislation and ethics.

College Requirement Courses Descriptions

Course Code: ENG115 Course Title: English for Healthcare Professionals I

Develop the language skills of reading, listening, speaking, and writing, emphasizing the language needs of healthcare professionals. Examine verbal and non-verbal communication skills, extracting ideas, paraphrasing, writing using the APA style and guidelines, and writing assessment reports. Comprehend the medical terminologies, prefixes, suffixes, and word roots.

Course Code: ENG125 Course Title: English for Healthcare Professionals II

Apply the language and communication skills of reading, listening, speaking, and writing at a higher level. Adopt critical reading skills, inferential comprehension, analytical report writing, and a research essay based on medical terminologies and the APA style and guidelines.

Course Code: LFS118 Course Title: Anatomy and Physiology I

The course covers the organization of the human body structure and function of cells, tissues, and organs. It also includes the gross and microscopic anatomy and physiology of the integumentary, skeletal, muscular, blood, cardiovascular and lymphatic systems.

Course Code: LFS128 Course Title: Anatomy and Physiology II

The course covers gross and microscopic anatomy and physiology of the nervous, special senses, endocrine, respiratory, digestive, urinary, and reproductive systems.

Course Code: STAT272 Course Title: Introduction to Biostatistics

Descriptive statistics, some basic probability concept, discrete and continuous probability distribution, estimation, hypothesis testing: one and two sample interference, analysis of variance, Inference of categorical data, simple linear and multiple regression and correlation, logistic regression, use statistical packages.

Course Code: LFS227 Course Title: Pathophysiology

In this course you will understand the basic pathophysiology of disease processes, their clinical manifestations, complications, diagnostic findings and management. You will also acquire knowledge to provide better disease management and apply critical thinking and analytical methods of inquiry regarding the disease processes.

Course Code: LFS217 Course Title: Microbiology

You will be introduced to the basic concepts of microbiology with special emphasis on microbial ecology, epidemiology and pathogenesis of infectious diseases. As health care professionals, you will be equipped to apply the concepts of microbial growth control in preventing the spread of infections in your daily life and in your professional field.
